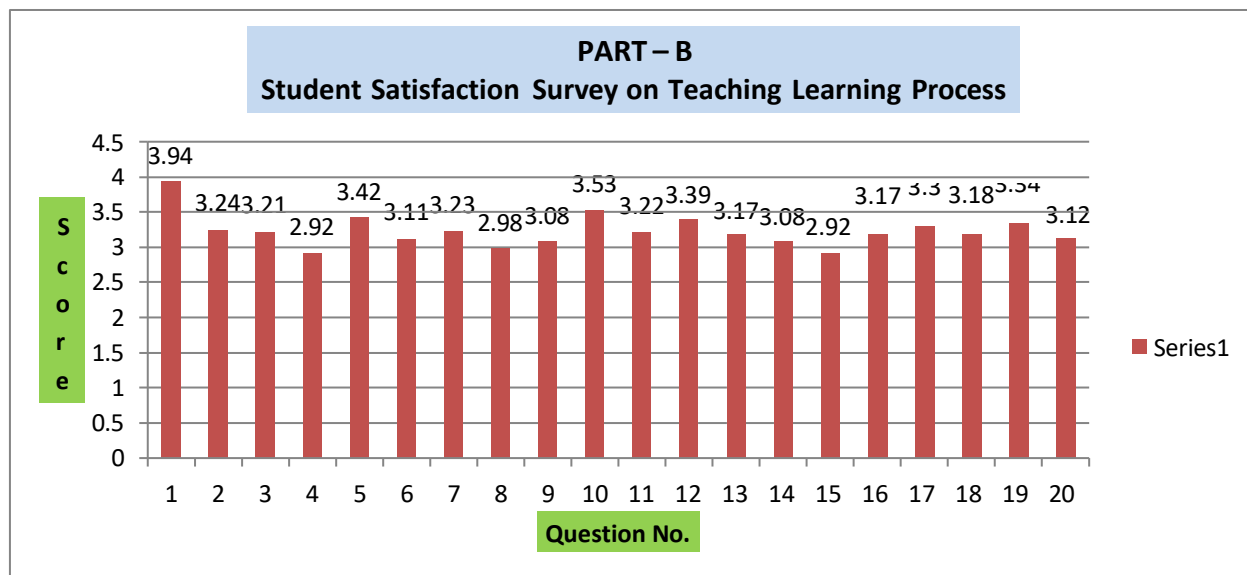

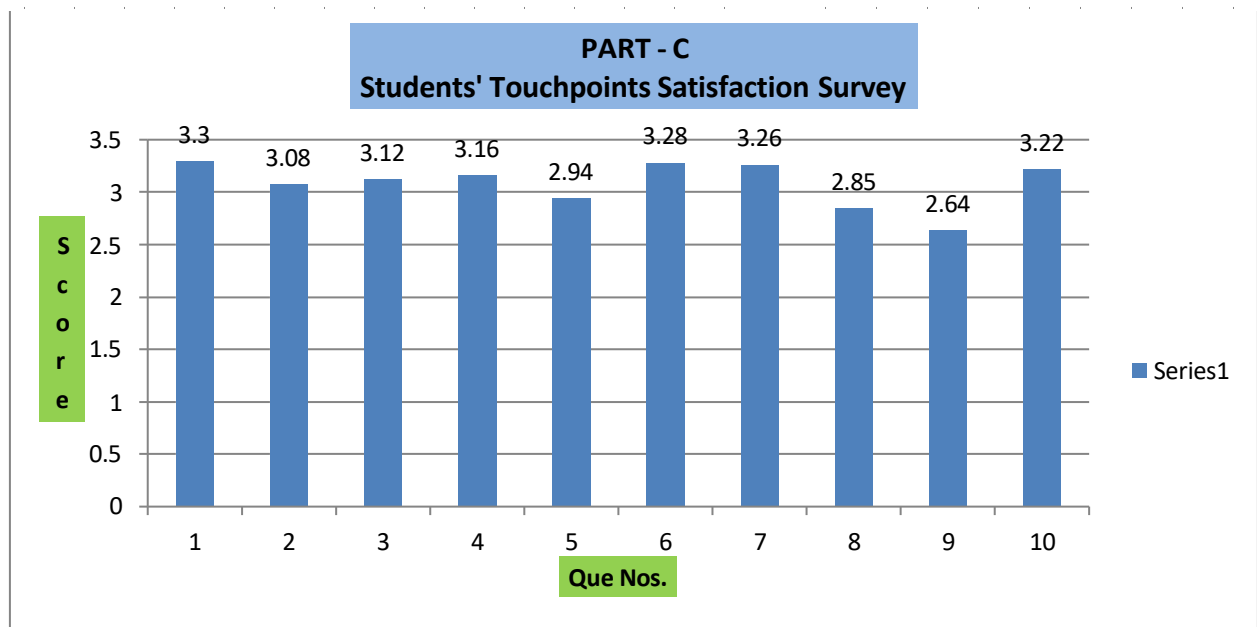

Finding & Analysis:

- Aprox. 81 % students participated in online survey.
- The average satisfaction score with respect to Teaching –learning & Evaluation process (Part-B) is 3.23 in a scale of 0 – 4 which is improved by 0.16 than the score on similar parameter last year (2021-22).
- The average satisfaction score with respect to Students’ touch points (Part-C) is increased by 0.09 (Score: 3.08) as compared to the last year’s score 2.99 in a scale of 0 – 4.
- In post pandemic scenario, Institute ensured uninterrupted academic delivery to the students. Institutional activities including Seminars, Conferences, FDPs, Summits, Guest lecturers have been organized in again in offline mode. Emphasis have been given in improving infrastructure facilities.

Institutional Achievements in 2023-24:

- Institute has been accredited with A+ Grade (Score-3.34) by NAAC in 3rd cycle for 5 years.
- Appreciation letter from Honorable Governor of UP and Vice Chancellor of AKTU for NAAC accreditation
- NBA Re-accreditation of MCA Program for 3 years
- Registration of Alumni association

Actions taken on last year's plan:

- In post Covid scenario, Institute followed instructions provide by the University time to time in beginning of the session 2023-24.
- The session got delayed due to late start.
- Online certification courses by the faculty and students.
- Organised online FDPs on research for learners.
- Green and Energy audit was conducted for the institute.
- Tutorial classes for slow and advanced learners.
- Consultancy assignment was undertaken

Action Plans for Continual Improvement:

- Institute has Business Incubation of MSME, however funds to support start-up projects of students may be allocated.
- Having good industry connect, Institute has better opportunities of mobilization of funds through consultancy services and funded projects.
- Limited scope of addition in syllabus regarding contemporary topics, however Institute has supplemented this limitation through regular guest lectures and events on contemporary issues.

- There is a scope of placements in diversified portfolios and better companies.
- Institute has received grants for Conferences and FDPs from AICTE and DST in past, however more funding sources for funding institute initiatives may be explored.
- Institute has adequate infrastructure facilities for indoor sports however tie-up with external body may be explored for outdoor sport events.
- Existing MoUs with institutions to be leveraged.
- Training & Consultancy services to be enhanced.
