





- More opportunities for participation in co-curricular activities inhouse and outside should be given.



Finding & Analysis:

- Aprox 81 % students participated in online survey.
- The average satisfaction score with respect to Teaching —learning & Evaluation process (Part-B) is 3.02 in a scale of 0 4 which is slightly lower by 0.29 than the score on similar parameter last year (2019-20). This may be largely because of sudden shift from offline mode of teaching to Online mode due to Covid pandemic.
- Slight decline in the scores of questions requiring face to face interaction with students has been observed.
- The average satisfaction score with respect to Students' touch points (Part-C) is decrease by 0.125 (Score: 2.96) as compared to the last year's score 3.085 in a scale of 0 – 4.



- Due to pandemic very few classes have been conducted in offline mode. It was largely online. Institute ensured uninterrupted academic delivery to the students on licensed zoom platform.
- Most of the institutional activities including Seminars, Conferences, FDPs,
 Summits, Guest lecturers have been organized in online mode.

Actions taken on last year's plan:

- Due to Covid, Institute followed instructions provide by the University time to time.
- Conducted curricular and co-curricular activities online without compromising on quality.
- Online certification courses by the faculty and students.
- Organised online FDPs on research for learners.
- Regular sanitization in campus
- Need based online sessions for the students by faculty and external experts.

Action Plans for Continual Improvement:

- Faculty and students are to be encouraged for Value added online certification courses
- To promote activities of Institutions Innovation Council.
- The action plan for broader alumni engagement for the benefit of students is to be developed.
- Focus on leveraging technology for enhanced learning.
- · Hybrid classes in the time of uncertainty.
- To make Business Incubation centre of MSME more functional.



Conclusion:

Due to Covid pandemic, 2020-21 was the year of uncertainties. The academic institutions including ours were not free from its impact. Institute adopted online mode of teaching and learning very quickly and tried hard to deliver best possible learning experience to the students without interruption. To supplement learning, many activities including Seminars, conferences, FDPS, Guest lectures, Summits etc have been organized virtually throughout the year.
